E-SAFETY FOCUS



What games are ok for my child to play?

- ➔ There are many different online games and playing experiences currently available to children. Gaming may be the very first way that your child encounters life online so it's important they are safe online.
- ➔ It is important that games are the correct age rating. Like film classifications, these ratings are determined by the game's content. All video games sold in the UK are clearly marked with age ratings set by PEGI (Pan European Games Information). Some online games may also be age rated or be classified 'PEGI OK.'
- ➔ Many games allow children to play with other internet users and may have chat features enabled. Some games provide a "safe chat mode" where simple predetermined phrases can be used.
- ➔ Show an interest in the games your child is playing, play along with them as this will enable you to identify any potential safety issues such as 'in-app' adverts and whether the adverts displayed are suitable for the audience for which the app is intended.
- ➔ There have been news stories of young children running up large bills by inadvertently making 'in-app' purchases whilst playing games. It's worth checking this to avoid costly bills! You can disable 'in-app' purchasing on a number of devices within the settings menu.
